- **3. GRANTING OF DISPENSATIONS:** The Council resolved to delegate the power to grant dispensations to the clerk at the Parish Council Meeting held on 6 November 2012. No dispensations were required.

She added that a shadow Council would be in place. Cllr Burch stated that the Parish Council had functioned very well during recent changes and she commended the Chairman.	
6.	Update on Open Items: Recreation Ground: The clerk advised that the hole made by Southern Electric when repairing a fault had now been filled. Bowey Field: The clerk was requested to chase DCC regarding the possible flooding at Chapel Cottage.	Clerk to contact DCC
7.	OTHER ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION: Community Speed Watch: Cllr Gartside advised that contact had been made with the relevant officer at Dorset Police and there appeared now to be sufficient support in the community to pursue this. A number of volunteers would be required to operate it and she requested people to come forward. Cllr Gartside stated she is advised that Community Speed Watch is required to gather evidence of traffic speed and proposed that she pursue this initiative with a view to achieving a 20mph limit. This was seconded by Cllr Weeks and agreed by Council.  Fippenny news printing: Mr Day, the Fippenny news editor, advised that he had obtained nine quotations and the recommended option was Old Sarum Printing, this had proved to be the cheapest and most professional business. It was proposed by Cllr Weeks and seconded by Cllr Fox that the preferred quotation be accepted.  Review of Alcohol Licence for the Football Club: Following discussions, Cllr Fox proposed to allow the football club to continue to have an alcohol licence at the pavilion as no problems had arisen. This was seconded by Cllr Weeks and agreed by Council.  Allotment Rent Increase: The clerk advised that the allotment rent had been increased from £400 to £550 per annum. The Council were disappointed with the increase but agreed that the increased rent should be paid. The Chairman advised that Cllr Banning had sent his comments by email as follows: The application meets policies regarding Design and Amenity but one concern is with regard to the stable building. This appears to be a separate dwelling, albeit connected by a covered walkway to the main house. An additional separate permanent dwelling (or dwellings) should not be created on the site of an existing dwelling in the countryside as this would undermine the general policy of restraint. Policy 28 permits replacement dwellings in the countryside on a one for one basis (one existing dwelling to be replaced by one new dwelling). It also seeks to ensure that an additional separate dwelling (or dwellings) is not created through the alteration or extension of an existing dwelling or the construction of an ancillary building within an existing residential curtilage. Whilst the creation of ancillary residential accommodation for a dependent relative (sometimes known as a granny annex) may be acceptable, any proposal to increase the number of separate residential units (for example, by replacing one existing dwelling with
