The Clerk granted dispensations to all Councillors for all meeting up to April 2019 to enable them to discuss the Precept for the year 2019/20.

5.	District & County Councillors' Reports: Cllr Batstone advised the harmonisation of Council Tax across the new Unitary Council area would take place this year. This would mean a larger increase for residents in North Dorset as their Council Tax was currently the lowest. She advised that she had been involved in an enquiry day in relation to special needs education. Cllr Batstone urged people to keep reporting pot holes as the County Council had been given a £6m grant for this purpose.	
	 Public Participation: The public were given the opportunity to address the Parish Council on any item on the agenda or to add items for discussion at future meetings. Members of the public raised the following: There had been 3 major bonfires at Pleydells farm, causing black smoke. Local cars had been covered in ash. Item to be put on next month's agenda. The Village Hall Extension had been given the go ahead, how would this be funded and who would be responsible. Clerk to write to all trustees and Village Hall Management Committee. In relation to a question raised regarding obtaining independent legal advice on the responsibilities of the Village Hall Management Committee, the Chairman advised that this would be looked at in the near future. DAPTC: Cllr Weeks advised that the DAPTC had recently met. The main topic discussed was the closure of the Durweston bridge for an extended period of time in the summer and the effect this would have on local villages and residents. Village Community Group: The cinema had now started. The Chairman of the Village Community Group had now left the village, leaving a vacancy for Chairman. Village Hall: Cllr Rowe advised that the Village Hall Committee had met last night where it was announced that work on the extension would commence in March. She advised that at the meeting in November, the trustees had asked the Committee to provide an update to the Parish Council, this had not been done. Concerns were raised that the Parish Council, as custodian trustees, could be responsible if things went wrong. It was agreed that the Parish Council would write to the Village Hall Committee asking for assurances that the finance to complete the project was in place. PCC: The church council had now re-submitted the planning application for the re-ordering of the church and it was hoped that a decision would be made by the end of February, fund raising would then begin. If planning permission was granted works would include a toilet, new kitchenette and underfloor heating. This would enable the church to be used 7 days a week. 11.
