10. REPRESENTATIVES REPORTS:

Rights of Way/Footpaths: The footpath officer advised that he had received 5 complaints that the new owner of Mill Farm had blocked of the footpath behind the chicken sheds. The owner had now agreed to install a style over the fence.

Transport: Cllr Rowe advised that the bus timetable has been placed too high for people to read it. The Clerk was asked to contact the us company to have it lowered.

Village Hall: Cllr Rowe advised that the recent jumble sale had raised £200 and £270 had been raised selling teas to cyclists. The Village Hall Committee would be distributing a questionnaire on the future of the Fippenny Fair. Following concerns raised about the design of the new kitchen extension, expert advice was being sought.

PCC: Cllr Le Riche advised that permission had now been granted for the re-ordering of the Church. There was a 28-day petition period before fund raising would commence. It was hoped that work to re-order the church would begin in 2021.

School: Cllr Le Riche gave the following update from the Chair of Governors:

We started the new academic year as part of the Sherborne Area Schools trust. During the summer holidays a lot of improvements to the fabric of the school were made including a new kitchen, replacement of some of the toilets and general redecorating.

We have a highly skilled and experienced team of teachers under the leadership of our headteacher Mrs Peters, and the children are making good progress. Since joining the academy we are now closely linked with Shillingstone primary school, which allows us to share facilities and staff which otherwise we would not be able to afford, for example we now have someone who is responsible for supporting our children with learning difficulties and she spends two days with us and two days at Shillingstone. This will help us to get the extra support that these children need.

Our main problem at the moment is the falling number of children attending the school and the Academy are helping us with the promotion and marketing of school. They have someone who is an expert in this field and she will be helping us to attract children to our lovely school where we offer small classes, individual attention and an environment where a child can grow in confidence and flourish.

Currently we are in the process of creating a new and special outside play area for the children in reception and year one, to which you kindly contributed £2000, we are planning a grand opening to which the press will be invited. We will let you know the date and time of the event and hope you and plenty of people from the village will join us. On 25th October the children will be demonstrating what they have learned in their special projects as part of the curriculum which includes 'A life in the day of' in which the younger children have explored the different jobs that people do such as fireman, tree surgeon, farmer etc. the older children are looking at 'Crime and Punishment' they will be setting up a learning street dressing, up in character and there will be exhibits of the work they have done. Again, everyone is very welcome to join us for this event and we would welcome your support.

Cllr Le Riche responded to some rumours around the village.

- The Chair of Governors was not leaving the village
- The school will not become a forest school, although some of the younger children will be doing more learning outside.
- The school will not be closing, the Academy has spent a considerable amount of money on the school and will continue to do so.
